HEARING OF THE CITIZENS - Agenda Items only

Mayor Tagliarini asked anyone wishing to be heard on agenda items to come forward and state their name and address. There being no one wishing to be heard Mayor Tagliarini declared the Hearing of the Citizens closed.

PROCLAMATION

Mayor Tagliarini read the following proclamation:

TOURETTE SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome (TS) is an inherited neurological disorder that is characterized by involuntary physical and vocal tics that occur many times a day;

WHEREAS, Tourette Syndrome is often accompanied by other conditions such as attention deficit and obsessive compulsive disorder, learning disabilities, and depression; and

WHEREAS, the neurological disorder known as “Tourette Syndrome” (TS) affects 1 in 100 children. More than 20,000 school age children in the State of New Jersey alone are dealing with TS and although some of these cases are aided by medication, there is no standard treatment known cure for this disorder; and

WHEREAS, there is an important need for more professional help with interest and expertise to identify, counsel and treat people with TS, with the lag time between initial onset of symptoms and proper diagnosis for those who do seek help still averaging more than seven (7) years; and

WHEREAS, positive actions to assist those children and families dealing with TS would result from a broadening of public and professional knowledge and acceptance of TS; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Center for Tourette Syndrome is the first and only program of its kind in the nation and they are actively providing services to families, educating medical professionals, teachers, social workers and supporting research to understand the signs and treatments of TS.

NOW, THEREFORE, ON BEHALF OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL, I, FRED TAGLIARINI, MAYOR OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ABERDEEN, do hereby proclaim Thursday, June 4, 2015 will be recognized as “TOURETTE SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY” in the Township of Aberdeen, as a special day to promote understanding, compassion, and acceptance for all of our fellow citizens who deserve and need our support to break the stigma that is related to Tourette Syndrome.

Mayor Tagliarini presented the proclamation to Mrs. Martha Santiago, who has a nine year old son with Tourette Syndrome.

Mayor Tagliarini stated he received a letter regarding an individual who is a Super storm Sandy survivor, significant volunteered at the Chelsea Village fire and Ken Gardens fire; she is a member of First District 1 Ladies Auxiliary. It is a great honor and pleasure to

acknowledge Judy Scheller publicly for all the great work she has done in our town.

Mayor Tagliarini presented Judy with a “Certificate of Appreciation”. Judy Scheller thanked everyone.

HEARING OF THE CITIZENS/CORRESPONDENCE AND PETITIONS

Mayor Tagliarini asked any member of the public wishing to be heard to come forward and to state their name and address.

Councilman Cannon stated this is an important meeting with adopting the budget. This is difficult year in Aberdeen, a lot of the debt incurred during Super storm Sandy infrastructure has come due in the short term notes, which has unfortunately increased our debt service almost \$450,000. The fortunate news is that we will be receiving additional FEMA funding. The total increase in tax levy is \$431,000, which is less than the debt service increase. Councilman Cannon stated everyone is aware of the budget cap laws. We are under all caps. This is an important point to make.

There being no one else wishing to be heard Mayor Tagliarini declared the Hearing of the Citizens closed.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING TOWNSHIP COUNCIL TO ENTER INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, the Township Council are mindful of the right of the public to attend and witness meetings of Governmental Bodies at which public business is discussed, and to be involved in all phases of governmental action; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act nonetheless recognizes the authority of a public body to exclude the public from meetings in certain enumerated instances in which disclosure of matters discussed could endanger public safety, property or other public interest, or invade individual privacy; and

WHEREAS, as authorized by the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A 10:4-12(b), the Township Council have a need to meet in private session to discuss:

- _____ (1) Matters expressly rendered confidential by law;
- _____ (2) Matters, the disclosure of which would jeopardize the receipt of federal funds;
- _____ (3) Matters threatening unwarranted invasion of individual privacy;
- _____ (4) Matters affecting collective bargaining of public employees
- _____ (5) Matters involving acquisition of real property with public funds, or investment of public funds, where disclosures would jeopardize such acquisition or investments;
- _____ (6) Tactics and techniques utilizing in protection of public safety or property; matters concerning investigations of violations or possible violations of the law;
- _____ (7) Matters affecting pending or anticipated litigation to which the public body may be party; matters within the attorney-client privilege;
- _____ (8) Personnel matters concerning the employment, appointment evaluation, promotion or termination of a public officer or employee;
- _____ (9) Deliberations which may result in the imposition of civil penalty or the Suspension or loss of license or permit.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Council will meet in private session at 8:17 P.M. on June 4, 2015, to discuss the following specific items:

POTENTIAL LITIGATION – COAH AND UNSAFE STRUCTURES;
CONTRACTUAL-FIELD SPONSORSHIP
