The Aberdeen Township Police made the following arrests July 19, 2017 through July 25, 2017:

- On July 24 a 30-year-old Holmdel man was arrested on a contempt warrant out of Aberdeen municipal court. P.O. Anthony Marone was the arresting officer.
- A 39-year-old Aberdeen man was arrested on July 24 for simple assault and criminal mischief following an incident on Phillip E. Frank Way. P.O. Gus Grivas was the arresting officer.
