The Aberdeen Township Police made the following arrests August 2, 2017 through August 8, 2017:

- A 15-year-old township youth was taken into custody for possession of marijuana on Parva Place on August 2. Sgt. Matthew Lloyd was the arresting officer.
- A 24-year-old Aberdeen woman was charged with possession of marijuana following a motor vehicle stop on Shore Concourse on August 2. P.O. Ronald Osadacz was the arresting officer.
- On August 3 two township youths were taken into custody for violation of the curfew ordinance following an incident on South Amboy Ave. P.O.s Raymond Campbell and Bruce Monro were the arresting officers.
