The Aberdeen Township Police made the following arrests January 25, 2017 through January 31, 2017:

- On January 31 a 40-year-old Middletown woman was arrested on a contempt warrant out of Aberdeen municipal court. P.O. Mary Johnston was the arresting officer.
- A 42-year-old Freehold man was arrested on January 31 for writing bad checks. Det. Anthony Valentino was the arresting officer.
